"Joy" is a Spirit produced rejoicing that increases as we know God and His promises.

John Piper ..."The gospel is not a way to get people to heaven; it is a way to get people to God. It's a way of overcoming every obstacle to everlasting joy in God..."

Acts 5:41 – "So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for His name."
