I. The Blessed

Immensely fortunate, greatly happy, & having the capacity to greatly impact others.

- 1. Blessed are the righteous poor.
- 2. Blessed are the righteous <u>hungry</u>.
- 3. Blessed are the righteous who weep.
- 4. Blessed are the righteous who are persecuted for Christ.

Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me."

Matthew 16:24

For to you it has been granted for Christ's sake, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake
