I. We must learn to righteously judge others.

2. We cannot accurately judge ourselves.

"With me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you....In fact, I do not even judge myself....But he who judges me is the Lord. Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord comes."

1 Corinthians 4:3-5

3. The Lord is able to righteously 'judge" & "grow" His servants.

"Who are you to judge the servant of another? To his own master he stands or falls; and stand he will, for the Lord is able to make him stand." Romans 14:4

I. For Starters:

- 5. What do you think might be going through her head right now?
- 6. In verse 7 Jesus wants them to realize something- what is it?
- 7. Read verse 11. Jesus ends this scene with grace and a warning. Why must both be present in our life to reach maturity?
