- 10. What did Jesus want to reassure the woman about during this encounter? (47-48)
- 11. What question did this cause the guests to ask? (49)
- 12. What is the result of true salvation? (50)
- 13. Do you ever find yourself acting like Simon? When?
- 14. Have you ever praised or worshipped God in a way that people would think that you were obsessed with Jesus? Why or why not?
- 15. How do "feel" around people who have "questionable" lifestyles likes homosexuals, prostitutes, "druggies" etc.?
- 16. Jesus was known as a friend of sinners. What does it take to be known as a friend of sinners?
