"Dysfunctional" - Malfunctioning or behaving outside the model.

II. God's plan goes forward through a dishonest man. 27:18-40

III. God's plan goes forward in the disobedience of mankind. 27:41-46

John 13:27 - "As soon as Judas took the bread, Satan entered into him. So, Jesus told him, "What you are about to do, do quickly.""

John 13:31 – "When Judas was gone, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man is glorified and God is glorified in Him."

- 5. What hope does it give you to know that God works even through our deceit and sinfulness to accomplish His plan?
- 6. How does the truth that God's plan is always working out for God's glory and our ultimate good help you face the surprises, disappointments, and hardships of your life?

Preparing for Next Sunday The Story Begins: The God That Gives You New Names Genesis 32: 22-32

- 1. Read the passage and ask the Lord to reveal Himself and His truth to you. (Genesis 32:22-32)
- 2. HIGHLIGHT a verse or truth that stands out to you and write it out.
- 3. EXPLAIN the text in your own words to make sure you see the big picture of God's Story. (Who wrote it & why was it written? To whom it was written? What is the context? How does the text point to the Father, Son or Spirit? What is the text telling us about our new identity as believers in Christ or what we are to be doing?)
- 4. APPLY a truth from the text to your own life. (Focus on what God is saying to you and what is your act of obedience, confession, praise, giving thanks, etc.)
- 5. RESPOND in prayer and go live out what God reveals to you from the Scriptures.
