Hebrews 12:15 – "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many."

Marks of Bitterness toward a person:

Hates thinking or even hearing about a person. Refuses to forgive and release. Refuses to do good or pray. Will not celebrate victories. Often self-righteous, cynical, critical and unhappy. Holds rigid expectations for other's lives. Wants punishment. Seeks to make the person look bad. Often distrusts and despises authority and accountability. Refuses to believe God or His promises.

I. God always brings godly fruit out of our affliction. Genesis 41:38-57

Psalm 105:16-18 - "And God called for a famine upon the land...He sent a man before them, Joseph, who was sold as a slave. They afflicted his feet with fetters, he himself was laid in irons; until the time that his word came to pass, the word of the Lord tested him."

II. God always overrules evil with good. Genesis 50:15-25

Hebrews 11:22 - "It was by faith that Joseph, when he was about to die, said confidently that the people of Israel would leave Egypt. He even commanded them to take his bones with them when they left."

1 Peter 2:23 - "When He was reviled, He did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but continued entrusting Himself to Him who judges justly."

Preparing for Next Sunday The Glory of Christmas John 1:14-18

- 1. Read the passage and ask the Lord to reveal Himself and His truth. (John 1:14-18)
- 2. HIGHLIGHT a verse or truth that stands out to you and write it out.
- 3. EXPLAIN the text in your own words to make sure you see the big picture of God's Story. (Who wrote it and why was it written? To whom it was written? What is the context? How does the text point to the Father, Son or Spirit? What is the text telling us about our new identity as believers in Christ or what we are to be doing?)
- 4. APPLY a truth from the text to your own life. (Focus on what God is saying to you. What is your response of obedience, confession, praise, giving thanks?)
- 5. RESPOND in prayer and go apply what God reveals to you from the Scriptures.
