

God Delivers: God of Our Relationships Exodus 20:12-21

1. Love God and honor our parents. 20:12

"Honor"- Give respect and appreciation in abundance.

Ephesians 6:1; Romans 12:10; 1 Timothy 5:8

~ God is always worthy of honor.

~ Because of sin, we may need to honor parents in varying ways and at a distance.

Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 22:24; 1 Corinthians 5:11

2. Love God and do not murder. 20:13

"Murder" - The selfish taking of a life.

Matthew 5:21-22

~ God is sovereign and He authorizes the giving and taking of life.

3. Love God and do not commit adultery. 20:14

"Adultery" - Replacing our spouse as the focus of our desires and intimacy.

Matthew 5:27-28

~ God is holy and faithful.

4. Love God and do not steal. 20:15

"Stealing" - Taking or keeping what does not belong to us.

Matthew 6:19-21

~ God is our provider.

5. Love God and do not give false testimony. 20:16

"False Testimony" - Selfishly lying, deceiving, or falsifying information

Matthew 5:37

~ God is truthful.

6. Love God and do not covet. 20:17

"Coveting"- Craving what belongs to another believing it will satisfy me.

Matthew 6:32-33; Matthew 5:17

~ God is good and sufficient.

8. How is our mission to reach the world with the gospel hindered by coveting? Discuss the quote below and pray as God leads.

Preparing for Next Sunday God Delivers: The Lawgiver's Tabernacle Exodus 25:1-9

1. Read Exodus 25:1-9 and ask the Lord to reveal Himself and His truth.
2. HIGHLIGHT a verse or truth that stands out to you and write it out.
3. EXPLAIN the text in your own words to make sure you see the big picture of God's Story.
4. APPLY a truth from the text to your own life. (Focus on what God is saying to you and what is your act of obedience, confession, prayer, praise, giving thanks, etc.)
5. RESPOND in prayer (use Scriptures as a prayer guide) and apply what God reveals to you.
