I. Devoted to <u>God above others</u>. (Luke 2:40-47)

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 - "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall <u>love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul</u> <u>and with all your might</u>...And these words that I command you today <u>shall be</u> <u>on your heart</u>. You shall <u>teach them diligently to your children</u> and shall <u>talk</u> <u>of them</u> when you <u>sit</u> in your house, and when you <u>walk</u> by the way, and when you <u>lie down</u>, and <u>when you rise</u>."

II. Devoted to <u>God's will</u>. (Luke 2:48-50)

Mark 3:35 - "Jesus said, 'For whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

III. Devoted to ministering to others. (Luke 2:51-52)
