Psalm 57:1 - "...in you my soul takes refuge...I will take refuge, till the storms of destruction pass by."

Psalm 107:29 - "He made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed."

Isaiah 43:2 - "When you go through deep waters I will be with you."

Luke 8:23-25 – "...as they sailed (Jesus) fell asleep... a windstorm came down...they were filling with water and were in danger. ...he awoke and rebuked the wind and the raging waves, and they ceased, and there was a calm. He said to them, 'Where is your faith?"

November 10, 1975, the SS Edmund Fitzgerald sank in Lake Superior

Captain McSorely - "We're in a big sea. I've never seen anything like it in my life."

"We're holding our own."

Ten minutes later - 29 people are off the radar.
