The Story Begins: Suffering and Joy in Christ Job 1 2-9-20

Main Idea: God is always present and orchestrating our suffering for His glory and our good.

I. God is in Control. Job 1:6-12

Views on Evil and Suffering:

- 1. God is not all loving.
- 2. God is not all powerful.
- 3. God does not exist.
- 4. Suffering is an illusion.
- 5. Suffering glorifies Him and brings good.

II.God is to be Feared. Job 1:8

"Fear God" – Worshipping God for His great worth and having a holy fear of hurting His name.

Exodus 20:20 — "Moses said... '<u>Do not be afraid</u>; for God has come to test you...that the fear of Him may remain with you, <u>so that you may not sin</u>."

Psalm 31:19 — "How great is Your goodness...for those who fear You...who take <u>refuge</u> in You..."

Psalm 112:1 – "...How <u>blessed</u> is the man who fears the LORD, Who <u>greatly delights</u> in His commandments."

Proverbs 9:10 – "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom..."

Proverbs 14:26 – "In the fear of the LORD there is <u>strong confidence</u>...his <u>children have</u> <u>refuge</u>."

Isaiah 33:6 - "The fear of the LORD is his treasure."

III. Satan is Always at Work. Job 1:7, 11

1 Peter 5:8 — "Be <u>sober-minded</u>; be <u>watchful</u>. Your <u>adversary</u> the <u>devil</u> <u>prowls</u> around like a <u>roaring</u> lion, seeking someone to <u>devour</u>."

- 1. <u>Sober Minded</u>- 3525 *néphō* to be sober, free from illusion and intoxicating influences of sin. Having a clear presence of mind for God honoring choices.
- 2. <u>Watchfu</u>l-1127 *grēgoreúō* to stay awake, be attentive and alert, responsible and watchful.
- 3. <u>Adversary</u>- 476 *antidikos* a prosecuting attorney, an opponent, accuser that brings charges to bring punishment.
- 4. <u>Devil</u>- 1228 *diábolos* to slander, accuse, defame—unjustly criticizing to hurt ,condemn and bring down.
- 5. <u>Prowls-</u> 4043 *peripatéō* walk *around* in a complete circle, waiting, watching and stalking prey.
- 6. Roaring- 5612 Oruomai howl as a wild beast, boisterous sound.
- 7. <u>Devour-</u> 2666 *katapino* destroy, swallow up, drink something down, consume, drown, overwhelm.

IV. <u>Joy in God is Secure in Suffering</u>. Job 1:13-22

Fighting for Joy:

1. Be honest.

Job 9:16 — "Job said, 'If I summoned Him and He answered me, I would not believe that he was listening to my voice."

- 2. Choose Christlike friends.
- 3. Draw near to God.

Job 42:5-6 — "Job said, 'I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you... I repent in dust and ashes."

Philippians 3:10-11 — "That I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death."

Discussion Questions for the Week

- 1. What is your typical response to suffering in your life?
- 2. Explain the Gospel and how it addresses our suffering?
- 3. How do you tend to respond to disappointment?
- 4. What would you tell someone that is suffering to the point of leading him/her to doubt God's presence and goodness?
- 5. What are some ways we can encourage and care for one another in times of suffering? (Proverbs 18:21, 20:5, 1 Peter 5:7, 1 John 3:18)
- 6. Whom do you know is in a season of adversity or suffering, and how will you assure him or her of God's care this week?
- 7. How has God used suffering in your life to draw you closer to Jesus? Helped you minister to others?
- 8. How would you rate your willingness to suffer for the Gospel of Jesus? Pray for one another using Luke 9:22-24 and Luke 12:19-21.
